From the Rector's Study

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I thank God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, for all the bountiful blessings that God is pouring on this family of St Paul's in the Pines. God is calling us in many directions and we are responding with great excitement.

We had 55 people trek out to Trinity Center, which by all accounts was a wonderful time. And God blessed us all with a safe return. I thank Gail Brown so much for all the time and energy that she devoted to this event. Without her attention to detail and continued communications things would not have worked out so well. THANKS GAIL.

I am glad to tell you that we had 18 people attend the first 8am service on September 23rd. So we now offer three services during the week. We have the 8:00 and 10:30am Holy Eucharist on Sunday mornings and we also have the 6:pm Holy Eucharist with healing on Wednesday evenings. God is so good to us, all the time.

I am pleased to announce that we kicked off our first of many Episcopal Youth Community (EYC) gatherings also on the evening of September 23rd. The very capable leadership of Chuck Liebers and Saran Hasinger leads our EYC. There are also some of you who have said that you would be glad to support our youth as part of the EYC committee. Your support is greatly appreciated.

For the Adult Christian Formation classes on Sunday mornings we will be looking at the Book of Ruth for the next 3 or 4 weeks. We are going to look at Ruth's story and see if we can discern how something about God might be revealed and what message might be there for us in our day and time.

I must share with you now a comment made by our Bishop, the Rt. Rev. Clifton Daniel 3rd. On his visit with us on the 9th of September. The Bishop was quite pleased with the joyful hospitality he received that is inherently St Paul's. Oh, by the way, while the Bishop was here we had 1 Baptism, 5 Confirmations, 1 who was received, and 2 who reaffirmed their commitment to Christ. The Bishop preached a wonderful sermon about the inclusiveness of God and that God loves everyone, "No Exceptions." A few days after the Bishop's visit I attended an Executive Council meeting chaired by our Bishop. When we were on break and with a few people standing with the Bishop in a circle the Bishop reflected that he thinks that St Paul's in the Pines is the most multicultural parish in our diocese! WOW! That is something to be proud of (keeping a humble heart of course). As I pondered the Bishop's words I thought about what the company of heaven might look like. I'll bet they're pretty "multicultural" too. St Paul's is a wonderful place to worship. We don't look alike, feel or think the same way about everything, but we give thanks to the same God and worship the same God in Christ together where being multicultural assists us in seeing the living Incarnation in the vast expressions of the human condition. And we invite all others to join us in this worship, No Exceptions.

Youth Corner, Andrew DeJaynes

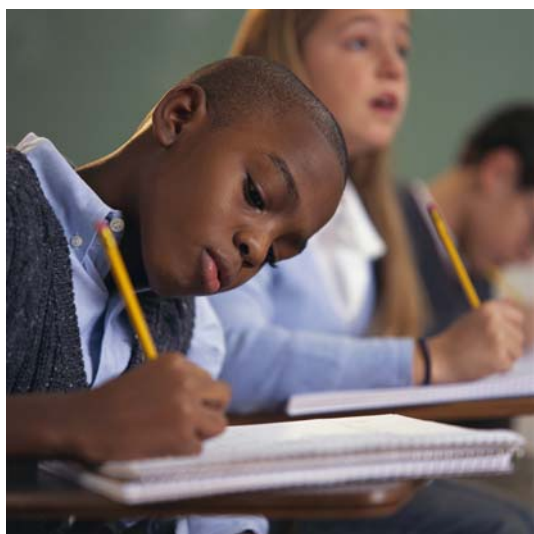
What a great month September was for me! For starters, I was confirmed by the Bishop. I bowled a high game of 265 and then I got to go on the Church Retreat.
